MARINE NOTES

TO LOAD HARD COAL.

SMALLEST THREE-MASTERS.

The two smallest three-masted schooners in the world are owned by Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. One is the Etta Howard, Capt. Heath, of Pugwash, 24 tons register, carries 35,000 feet of lumber; the other is the Maple Leaf, Capt. Fraser, St. John, 31 tons register, and carries 30,000 feet of lumber. The next smallest tern schooner hails from Maine, 35 tons register.

WHO OWNS THE ALLAN LINE?

A London cable says Sir Thomas Skinner and Thomas Reynolds have been appointed to the board of directors of the Allan Line, in addition to F. William Taylor. With the exception of Lord Strathcona, Sir Thomas Skinner is the only director of the C. P. R. resident in London, and is recognized as the active representative of the railway company's interests abroad. His acceptance of the seat on the Allan line board will have a tendency to confirm the repeated reports of closer future relations between the Allan line and the C. P. R.

ATTRACTIVE BOND ISSUE.

Toronto Paper Manufacturing Company Bonds Offered by Dominion Bond Company.

An offering of the 6 per cent. first mortgage sinking fund bonds of the Toronto Paper Manufacturing Company, Limited, will shortly be made by the Dominion Bond Company, Limited, of Toronto, Montreal, Vancouver and London, England. The total issue is \$500,000 in addition to the bonds, there is outstanding \$750,000 in common stock.

The net earnings of the plant for the year ending on Jan. 31, 1912 are estimated at \$100,000, which is 3 1/2 times the interest on the bonds. The plant is a matter of fact it is understood that the earnings for the months of July and August of the current year were 25 per cent. in excess of this estimate.

The Toronto Paper Manufacturing Company is the oldest and one of the best known makers of high grade linn, bond, book and lithographic papers in Canada. The plant at North London, consists of 21 buildings. The directors of the company are G. Grant, President; Dominion Bond Company, Limited; T. H. Watson, Vice-President; Standard Paper Mills, Limited; The Rev. Dr. William Briggs of the Methodist Book and Publishing House; R. W. Waldie, Director; Victoria Harbor Lumber Company; Richard Brown, Director; Brown Brothers, Limited; Stationers; R. A. Lyon, of Lyon & Plummer; and J. W. A. Rivers, River Pulp and Paper Mills, Limited.
