### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (not just Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader shall have within one mile of his homestead a farm of at least 10 acres, on certain conditions. Bachelors' claims are required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$10 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after settling homestead; patent also 50 acres; extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.

Such area of cultivated land is subject to reduction in case of rough scrubby or stony land. Bachelors' claims may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

## Belgium—Denmark

It is interesting to note just how the heroic Belgians regarded Beer. The following is an extract from a report of the Belgian Secretary of the Treasury, relative to the law abolishing taxes on Beer, Wine and Cider, a few years ago:
