April 25—An official statement received today from General Mande, commanding the British forces in Mesopotamia says that the British have driven the Turks from the west bank of the Shatt-El-Adhem to about seventeen miles north of its junction with the Tigris. Gen. Mande's total captures on Saturday and Sunday in the vicinity of Iztabilat were 687 prisoners and fifteen guns.


