C., Hilary Term, 1846. Is a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society, and of the Zoological Society, (Eng.); a member of the Council of the University of Trinity College, Toronto; President of the Mechanics' Institute and of the Horticultural Society of Toronto, and of the Bible Society of U. C. Was Mayor of Toronto, 1855. Has been President of the Canadian Institute, same city. Sat in Leg. Council, Can., for York Division, from 1858 until the Union, and was Chairman of the Private Bill Committee of that House, a position to which he was again elected in the Senate, on the opening of the Dominion Parliament, 1867.
