An Act to regulate the Education of Apothecaries, Chemists and Druggists, and for the sale of Poisons, &c.

WHEREAS there are no laws now in force in that part of the Preamble. Province of Canada, called Lower Canada which regulate, the professional education of Chemists, Druggists, and Apothecaries, and the sale of poisons, and whereas it is expedient on many 5 grounds, especially for the safety of the public health, that such a Law should exist; From and after the passing of this Act, the Act or Ordinance of the Legislative Council of the late Province of Quebec, passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, and entituled: An Act or Ordinance to prevent persons practising Ordinance, 28 10 Physic and Surgery within the Province of Quebec or Midwifery in G. 3, c. 8. the Towns of Quebec and Montreal without licence, shall be repealed.

I. From and after the passing of this Act, no person shall practice as Apprenticean Apothecary, Chemist, Druggist, or vendor or retailer of Mediship, &c, recines, in that part of the province, called Lower Canada, unless he sons acting as 15 shall have attained the age of twenty-one years, and shall have served Chemists and a regular and continued apprenticeship with some regularly licensed Druggists, &c. Apothecary, Chemist and Druggist in the said Province, for at least three years, and have obtained a Diploma from the College of Physicians and Diploma Surgeons after examination before the Board of Governors, and have required. 20 been found in every respect a fit and proper person to receive the said Diploma.

II. No person shall practice as an Apothecary, Chemist, Druggist, or Forther qualivendor, or retailer of Medicines in the Province aforesaid, without, pre-fications revious to his examination before the Board of Governors of the College of obtaining a 30 Physicians and Surgeons, affording evidence of a sound classical educa- Diploma tion with a competent knowledge of the French and English languages; producing a certificate of good moral caracter; of having regularly attended a course of Botany, of at least three months duration; two courses of Materia Medica, two courses of Chemistry, which courses shall. 0 be of six months' duration, at some recognised Medical College, or Public Medical School within her Majesty dominions: Provided always, that Provise: in nothing herein contained shall extend in any way, to prevent any persons having son, who is in possession of a Diploma, Certificate or License, of Apothe-already obcary, Chemist or Druggist, obtained in any part of Her Majesty's tained a dominions, from presenting himself for licence, as such, before the said Diploma in some part of Board of Governous and the Cally June 6 Planting and Control of Control Board of Governors of the Colledge of Physicians and Surgeons of Lower H.
