Dear Mr. Eby:

I have your letter of the 10th instant mentioning the idea of holding summer meetings in the interests of a peace propaganda in some of the smaller towns and cities, during the meaths of July and August, and suggesting Berlin as the locality for the first meeting.

Of the wisdom of such a course you would be the better judge, and I am hardly in a position to advise. It would depend, I presume largely on the wishes of your own society. I would be pleased indeed, should you decide on such a course, to have you give an address in Berlin. I am sure you would receive a splendid welcome there.
