Re No. 65 Fort William Band.

It appears that some time prior to 1900 Susan Ferreault married a Fort William Indian named St Germain. This Indian died and for several years his wife drew her annuity and band funds under #65 as Mrs. St Germain. She left Fort William about 1903 and her mother drew her money up to 1907. At the 1907 payment this money was given to Mrs. Josephine Dick who is a daughter of St Germain. Mrs. Dick has been drawing this money ever since. Mrs. St Germain is now back in Fort William and asks to be again put on the list.

I was speaking to J. F. Hodder, former agent regarding this case. He claims that the late Inspector McCrae put St Germain on the non-transmissible list without just reason. The parents of St Germain were Canadian Indians but they were camped on Drummond Island. Much when the subject was born. McCrae on this
