Ottawa, June 20, 1919.

Reverend Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 17th instant, in which you give the class standing of the senior girls in the Spanish Industrial School.

In reply I beg to say that the discharge of pupils Nos. 0287, Victoria Piconiasang, and 0334, Jane King, who have completed their Fifth Standard and Industrial Course is approved. Certificates of honourable discharge will be sent you for each of these girls.

With reference to pupils Nos. 062, Louise Cyrette, 0329, Josephine Commandant, 0336, Margaret Lavalley and 0394, Adeline Johnson, it is considered that they should remain in the school until they have finished their industrial course. It is noted that pupil No. 546, Stanley Mades, left the school in the care of his parents on the 15th instant, also, that No. 0488, Marie Diaume, left for her home in Caughnawaga on the 15th instant. A cheque for \$8.60, being the amount expended in the purchase of a railway ticket for this girl, will be sent in due course.

I have also to acknowledge the receipt of the doctor's certificate of health for pupil No. 0491, Tillie Akibimose. This is satisfactory but I beg to point out that the application for her admission, which should be signed by one or other of the parents, has not yet been received and this should be forwarded, made out on the proper form for that purpose.
