According to the churchwardens' report at Easter, 1893, the church debt at St. Paul's was \$12,655.13, or deducting assets as unpaid ground rent, unpaid subscriptions, and balance on hand," \$12,136.54, and as now the debt is between nine and ten thousand dellars, we have reason to be thankful that more than \$2,000 have been paid, or an average of between three or four hundred dollars a year.
