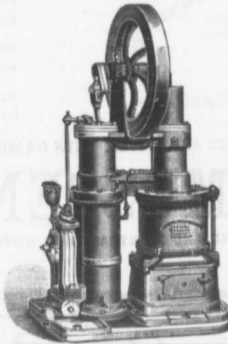


TORONTO, ONT.—G. W. Gouinlock, architect, has been engaged to prepare plans for a live stock arena to be built on the Exhibition Grounds, at a cost of \$110,000. Same architect has in hand plans for the reconstruction of Warwick Bros. & Rutter's building on Front street west.—Charles Home is reported to have purchased the property on the north-east corner of Bay and Wellington streets with the intention of building a large warehouse thereon.—H. E. Darragh, 92 Adelaide street west, wants tenders for reconstruction of buildings at 14 and 16 Adelaide street west for factory and show-rooms for the Canadian Show-Case Co.—F. H. Herbert, architect, is preparing plans for a modern and up-to-date bakery to be built on Czar street, near Yonge, for Lawrence Bros., also for thoroughly remodelling their present premises and erecting a large driving shed and stable; estimated cost of improvements, \$75,000.—The Board of Control is asking for tenders up to May 4th for erection of an administration building on the Exhibition Grounds, from plans by G. W. Gouinlock, architect.—C. J. Gibson, architect, has taken tenders for excavating, bricklaying, etc., at W.

J. Gage & Co.'s premises, Front street.—The Wyld-Darling Co. will likely build a seven-storey warehouse on the site of their burned premises.—Sir William Mulock, Postmaster-General, has purchased property on south side of Front street, near York, on which to build a power house in connection with the

pneumatic tube mail system to be established. It is estimated that the installation of the system will cost \$500,000.—The Assessment Commissioner has asked for an appropriation of \$23,000 for the enlargement of the Cowan avenue fire hall and erection of a two-storey brick hook and ladder house south of the

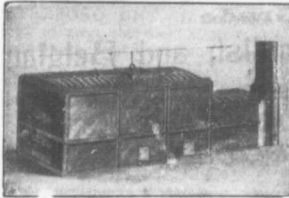

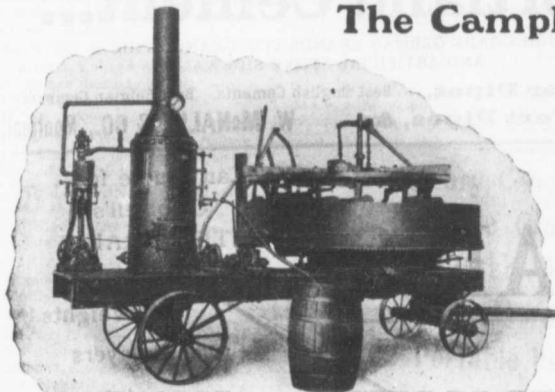
