Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

THE Scafon of the year being arrived in which your private concerns must neceffarily require your perfonal attention and induce you to wish to return to your Families, I confider it my duty to allow a remission of your attendance on the Public Business; but I should be extremely deficient in the duty I owe to His Majesty as well as to my own feelings. if I permitted you to depart without expressing to you the great fatisfaction I have received in observing the Zeal and Unanimity with which you have attended to the several Objects recommended to your Confideration, and the general harmony with which the business of the Session has been conducted.

Gentlemen of the Houfe of Assembly,

I have observed with peculiar pleasure the cheerfulness and cordiality with which you proceeded in re-establishing the Bill " For repealing " certain Acts granting Rates and Duties to His Majefty, and for grant-" ing new and additional Duties in lieu thereof, for appropriating the " fame towards defraying the expences of the administration of Juffice " and support of the Civil Government within this. Province, and for " other purposes therein mentioned;" commonly called " the Confoli-" dation Act ;"-and I must request your acceptance of my best thanks for your attention to the feveral other Objects that relate to the Revenue and neceflary Difburfements of the Province; nor must I omit taking particular notice of the zeal you have thewn in making to early a provifion for replacing the fums which His Majefty, in his paternal regard for the welfare and happinels of his faithful Subjects in this Province, has been graciously pleafed to authorize me to advance for defraying the expences to be incurred in erecting the intended new Court Houses in the Diffricts of Quebec and Montreal.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Council, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly,

The relief given to the poorer classes of His Majesty's Subjects in the cities of Quebec and Montreal by the Amendments made to that part of the Road Act which relates to those Cities and Suburbs, will, it is hoped, evince to the people at large, the readiness of the Legislature to

pay
