

SATURDAY, 3d FEBRUARY, 1798.

The House resolved itself into a Committee on the consideration of a bill
*"to provide for defraying the expences of the Public Service for the year one thousand
 seven hundred and ninety-five, and for disposing of the monies now in the Trea-
 sury"*—

Mr. Peters in the chair.

The Speaker resumed the chair—

The Chairman reported—that the Committee had taken the said bill into consideration, and had agreed thereto.

Ordered, That the said report be accepted, and that the bill be engrossed.

On motion, *Ordered*, That some Members be appointed to search the Journals of the Council as to their proceedings upon the bill *"for raising a Revenue in this Province and for appropriating the monies arising therefrom to the Public Services therein mentioned,"* and make report to this House.

Mr. Street and Mr. Campbell are appointed for that purpose.

Major Dixon, by leave, brought in a bill *"for altering the times and place of holding the Court of General Sessions of the Peace and Inferior Court of Common Pleas in the County of Westmorland"*—

And the said bill being read the first and second time, was ordered to be committed.

The Members appointed to search the Journals of the Council as to their proceedings upon the bill *"for raising a Revenue in this Province and for appropriating the monies arising therefrom to the Public Services therein mentioned"*—reported, that upon searching the said Journals they found the following entry :

"COUNCIL CHAMBER, Thursday, 1st February, 1798.

"Read a bill from the Assembly *'for raising a Revenue in this Province and for appropriating the monies arising therefrom to the Public Services therein mentioned'*—

"On motion of Mr. Justice Saunders—resolved unanimously, that the further consideration of this bill be put off for three months."

Mr. Glenie, by leave, brought in a bill *"to encourage the killing of Bears and Loup-cerviers."*

Which was read the first and second time, and ordered to be committed.

The House then adjourned until Monday next at eleven of the clock.

MONDAY, 5th FEBRUARY, 1798.

Read the second time, a bill *"in addition to and in amendment of an Act intituled 'an Act for the regulation of Seamen.'*

Ordered, That the said bill be committed.

The Chairman reported—That the Committee had taken the said bill into consideration, and had agreed thereto with amendments.

Read the third time as engrossed, a bill *"to provide for defraying the expence of the Public Service for the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety-five, and for disposing of the monies now in the Treasury."*

Ordered, That the said bill pass and be sent up for concurrence.
