obliged to buy he is often called upon to pay three times normal One instance of this is the price of imported fruits such as banan as, which formerly sold for from fifteen to twenty-five cents per doz-
en and now cost seventy. If patriotically inclined we should refrain from purchasing these expensive foreign products and in so far as we can do so endeavor to make our living on the products of our own
