U. S. STRENGTHEN PACIFIC FLEET
Washington, June 30.—Secretary Daniels reiterated his determination to increase the strength of the Pacific fleet with the opening of the Panama canal.

The secretary also announced that the ships of the Atlantic fleet, which are to lead the international parade out of Hampton roads for the canal opening next March, would remain in Pacific waters several months. He said they would be there the fourth of July next year, probably on Labor day and "possibly Christmas."

Mr. Daniels said in response to a question that the decision to strengthen the fleet in Pacific waters was not influenced by the Japanese situation.

UNIFORMS GIVEN ALPINE TROOPS

Kaiser Shows Interest in Swiss Soldier Since Visit

Berlin June 30.—The Kaiser, since his visit to the Swiss manoeuvres two years ago, has shown by several small acts, as well as in conversation with foreign officers, the great interest he takes in the Swiss army and its citizen soldiers.

He holds the opinion, it seems, that the present somewhat dark uniform worn by the Swiss Alpine troops makes them too conspicuous against a background of snow, and he has, therefore, just forwarded through his minister at Berne, 100 square yards of a specially made, grey-blue cloth, to the federal government.

The gift has been accepted by the Swiss authorities with thanks, and the cloth is now being converted for an Alpine company as an experiment.

TURKEY'S EXPENSES TO BE REDUCED

Coming Budget Expected to Show a Million Pounds Less Outgoings

Constantinople, Turkey, June 30.—In justification of the provisions in the Turkish budget during the coming year, it is stated that there will be a reduction of 1,000,000 in the year's expenses.

A scheme has been worked out which it is hoped will effect a general economy in conducting the affairs of the government. A large sum will also be saved by means of the decreased indebtedness of Turkey, as a result of the decision of the international finance commission in Paris, by which the Balkan states assumed a proportionate part of the indebtedness of Turkey, and it is therefore hoped that, taking into consideration these two facts, the expenses of the Turkish government will be reduced by at least \$1,000,000.
