VICE REGAL PARTY.

GIVEN AT THE VICE REGAL RECEPTION AT

MONCTON, N. B.

[Special To Globe.]

Moncton, Sept. 27.—His Excellency

the Governor General, on his arrival

in the city today, was given a perfect

ovation. As the special train conveying

His Excellency and retinue stopped at

the station, shortly after eleven o'clock,

thousands of people who thronged the

surroundings cheered lustily and as the

train stopped and His Excellency ap-

peared on the platform of his car con-

tinuous cheers greeted him. Lined

along in front of the train was a guard

of honor, and after being received by

Lieut. Governor McClellan, His Worship

Mayor Robinson and D. Pottinger, I. C.

R. general manager, His Excellency and

Lady Aberdeen alighted and were greet-

ed by the families of the "National

Antelope," by the Glendon Band, while

the guard of honor and the cavalry

presented arms and gave a general salute.

His Excellency, accompanied by Lady

Aberdeen and Lady Majorie Gordon

and the Lieutenant Governor, Mayor

Robinson and Mr. Pottinger and fol-

lowed by members of the City Council and

Board of School Trustees, then proceed-

ed to the platform, where His Excellency

was presented with an address of wel-

come from the City Council, read by

Mayor Robinson. On the platform

besides those already referred to were

Judges Huntington, Landry, Wells and

other prominent personages. His Ex-

cellency replied briefly to the address,

which he characterized as being very

gratifying both to himself and Lady

Aberdeen. After these proceedings had

been completed, the Vice-regal party

proceeded to the Victoria Hotel.

At 1.30 this afternoon the corner stone

of the new school building was laid by

Lord Aberdeen and an address on behalf

of the school board presented to him.

To-night a reception will be given by

the Vice-regal party in the Victoria Hotel.
