Hamilton began the senior Rugby championship season by journeying to London to meet the westerners, who had been diligently at work under a coach from the United States, and who had hopes of being able to hold the Tigers down. The Champions did not expect a walk-over, and they hoped for a good, stiff, opposition. A majority of from 10 to 20 points when all was well would have satisfied them, for they saw that a score of something like 30 or 35 to 15 or 20 would be a great deal better for all concerned than a one-sided victory. Moreover, London supporters of the club turned out in a large crowd, 1,000 to 1,200 being present, and they wanted to see their boys make a good showing. The crowd was swelled by over 100 from Hamilton, the chrysanthemums and the yellow and black badges of the Tiger supporters being very conspicuous in the grand stand, and their rooting being vigorous but good natured.

Hamilton won by 49 to 0, but the score does not represent the relative merits of the two teams. Hamilton could have scored more than 12 points in the second half, but the blank on London's side of the score sheet does not represent the Cockneys' strength. They can do a great deal better than they did on Saturday, and are up to give their supporters something to cheer for before the season is over.

Tigers played a very steady, even game. There were few mistakes, and when a Tiger made one of his mistakes, he recovered. The Tiger line was strong, but was fairly well checked by the opposing line. It was admitted, indeed, that the London line was not very much by comparison. The result was that when the ball was in London's possession the Cockney back division had just as good chances of brilliant play as the Tiger forwards had, but the failure of the London back section was complete.

While the work of the London line prevented the Tigers getting through, to a large extent, Marriot was a notable exception. He invariably got through and was always on the ball. Lyon did his leg hurt early in the game and did not play his usual dashing game, but when occasion offered he was on the spot and once got in a brilliant run for a try. Bickford also had his leg strained early in the game, and was replaced by Kirkpatrick, who played a strong game. Murray and Isabier followed particularly well and Craig's work was good. Barron never played a better game. Besides doing the onerous work of centre with the greatest accuracy he took a hand in the open work, tackling beautifully and getting in several fine runs. Just at the close of first half he got over the line with the ball after backing up Marriot and receiving the ball from him, and why the try was not allowed the spectators have not yet found out.

Captain Ballard at quarter and those behind him worked together beautifully. They passed from hand to hand or half way across the field with the same accuracy and with scarcely any mistakes. Moore's runs were the wonder of all, and when he started off the Londoners would set up a chorus, "get him, get him," but nobody got him. DuMoulin kicked, backed up, and played a very successful game. Stinson made many good gains with his running. Tope at full back did not miss a chance during the day and was equally successful no matter what he undertook.

As already stated London's weakness was all behind the line. Morrison at centre and McMahon at quarter were all right, but the others did not seem to understand their own signals. Time and again McMahon found himself with the ball in his hands and nobody to pass to, Clark, at centre half, was the one redeeming feature. He used his hands, his head and his feet, but got no support. Bice, the captain of the team, seemed to be lost in the mix-up, and Hague scarcely got an opportunity. Towards the end of the game he showed up to good advantage. Hueston at full back tackled well, but, after being back started a couple of times, seemed to have made a mere of almost every chance. It will take a lot of hard drilling in hand work to get the back section into shape. Once that is mastered, however, London will have a good team.
