INCREASING UNEMPLOYMENT. TOLEDO, Dec. 10. Suspension of work at the Autolite Plant, a subsidiary of the Willis Overland Co., on December fifteenth, will throw four hundred and fifty men out of work.

CLEVELAND, Dec. 10. The wages of seven thousand union mployees in the women's garment ndustry here, will remain unchanged inder a decision handed down last night by a board of referees between vorkers and manufacturers. The workers demanded fifteen per cent. ncrease and manufacturers fifteen er cent. decrease.

REFUSED INCREASE. MONTREAL, Dec. 10.

The refusal of the ladies' garment vorkers request for an increase of eight dollars a week is an outstanding feature of a decision rendered by an arbitration board between the workers and employees. This step is taken in view of the present depressed conditions of the garment industry, and the uncertain outlook.
