Winnipeg, Man., July 10.—Returning from settling a group of Russian White Army refugees on land west of Wetaskiwin, M. E. Thornton, superintendent of colonization for the Canadian Pacific railway, said he held high hopes for the success of the venture. The group numbered 115 and were the first so far brought over from Russia. Mr. Thornton said they were of a good type physically and mentally. Some had been wealthy farmers and business men under the Czarist regime, but had lost their possessions with the advent of the present government and had been compelled to seek safety in southern

Mr. Thornton instanced as a mark of their loyalty the fact that they hoisted a Union Jack over the tent he had provided for their reception, while a Russian Orthodox priest, who is one of the party, offered a prayer or the safety of King George.
