New York, March 11.—Again the rate-breaking fever has broken out among the coal and stove companies. Prices are being cut on all grades of coal, principally in chestnut, pea and nut sizes, and the same is true of these sizes now on hand, and the companies are so anxious to get rid of the stock and secure business that a little effort is being made to maintain the fixed schedule of prices established in 1906. The effect of this move in force is known as the "summer schedule," and is as follows, free of cartage and delivery, in New York city, egg and nut size, \$4; stove size, \$4.25. This is another case of prices of the past being different from the present actuality. It is stated in the trade that the roads are getting from \$3.40 to \$4.40 for coal, and that the low as \$3.75 for stove coal. Not long
