Buller in Camp At Laing's Nek

The Boers Obligated to Abandon Their Stronghold.

The Tunnel Dynamited at Both Ends, but Not Much Dam-

aged-Hunter Routs the Boers Around Smaldeel-Kruger Said to Have Carried Away \$17,500,000 in Gold

-British Casualties in Recent Operations.

London, June 14.-Gen. Buller entered Volksrust on Wednesday, passed through Charleston and encamped near Laing's Nek. The tunnel was not much damaged. Both ends were blown up, but the engineers think that repairs can be effected in about four days. The advance troops of Gen. Buller saw the Boer rear guard four miles distant yesterday. It was estimated that 8,000 Boers were withdrawing. The townspeople of Ermelo counted fifteen guns. Three hundred Free Staters, released from guarding Van Reenen's Pass, have gone to join President Steyn's commando in the eastern part of Orange River Colony.

BRITISH CASUALTIES.

Gen. Buller's casualties on June 10 have been issued by the war office. They are 26 killed, 126 wounded and 2 missing. London, June 13.-The following dispatch has been received at the war office from Lord Roberts: "Katsbosch, June 12.-In Monday's engagement Methuen had one killed and eighteen wounded. Among the latter is Lieut. Cearle, of the 12th Battalion of Yeomanry. "On June 7 the Derbyshire Militia lost 36 killed and 104 wounded, all of whom were in the yeomanry hospital, which was captured by the Boers and retaken by Methuen."

Beaten!

After an All-Day Fight With Roberts' Force.

The Enemy Abandon Their Second Strong Position-Walkerstrom Surrenders to Buller.

London, June 14.-Lord Roberts reports to the war office under date of Pretoria, June 13, 9:55 a.m., as follows: "Methuen advanced to Honingspruit yesterday, and found all quiet. Koonstad is strongly held. Methuen returned today to Renoster River, where the railway is being repaired. We were engaged all yesterday with Botha's army. The enemy fought with considerable determination and held our cavalry on both flanks; but Ian Hamilton, assisted by the Guards' brigade of Pole-Carew's division, pushing forward, took the hill in his front, which caused the enemy to fall back on their second position to the eastward. It is slightly higher than the one we have captured. The great extent of the country which has to be covered under modern conditions of warfare renders progress very slow. "Details of the casualties have not reached me, but I understand they are moderate in numbers. The only further casualties reported to date are two officers wounded."

THE ENEMY FELL BACK.

London, June 14.-The war office issues the following report from Lord Roberts under date of Pretoria, June 13, afternoon: "The enemy evacuated their strong position during the night and have retired to the eastward."

BULLER AND ROBERTS HELP EACH OTHER.

"Buller's force and mine have afforded each other mutual assistance. Our occupation of Pretoria caused numbers of Boers to withdraw from Laing's Nek, and Buller's advance to Volksrust made them feel their rear would shortly be endangered."

WAKKERSTROOM TENDERS SUB-

MISSION. Gen. Buller reports to the war office as follows: "Headquarters at Laing's Nek, June 14. Morning-Gen. Lytton yesterday received the formal submission of the town and district of Wakkerstroom, which the enemy is believed to have completely evacuated."

ADMIRAL SAMPSON'S PRIZE MONEY.

Washington, June 13.-The United States court of claims has passed upon the suit of Admiral W. T. Sampson and others under his command at Santiago for prize money on account of the destruction of the Spanish fleet. The court declares that Admiral Sampson was the commander-in-chief. The Spanish squadron is found by the court to be inferior to the American force, and a bounty of \$100 is awarded for every officer and man under Admiral Cervera's command. The total amount of bounty money allowed is \$166,700, of which Admiral Sampson will receive \$8,335, and Admiral Schley about \$3,000.
