PREST. MITCHELL'S GREAT INFLUENCE

Will Be Used Against a Strike of Soft Coal Miners.

OPENING OF THE CONVENTION

Majority of Delegates Said to Take the Same View as the President.

Indianapolis, July 17.—If the voice and influence of President Mitchell, of the United Mine Workers, shall prevail with the members of his organization, there will be no general strike of the organization. In his speech Mr. Mitchell advised strongly against a general strike, and urged that the bituminous miners remain at work and a series of assessments upon the members of the order, which he outlined, be carried into effect, as the best means of affording aid and support to the striking anthracite men in the east. If his recommendation had been adopted this afternoon, it would have settled the entire question for which the convention was called.

A motion to adopt the propositions of President Mitchell provoked a long debate, in which the general sentiment was against the ordering of a strike. The men from the anthracite regions finally made a request that they be allowed to hold a caucus to determine upon an expression of opinion. Their request was granted, and the adjournment taken. The men who were in favor of a strike were in a decided minority in the convention.

SYMPATHETIC STRIKES FAIL.

President Mitchell said in part: "Personally I wish to impress upon you a realization of the fact that their success will be yours and their defeat will be yours. Sympathetic strikes have many adherents, and in many cases such methods appeals strongly to those who, being directly involved in trouble, do not always recognize the effect of their action upon the public mind, but the past history of the labor movements teaches lessons that should not be forgotten today. As far as my knowledge goes, I do not know of any solitary sympathetic strike of any magnitude which has been successful. On the contrary, the most conspicuous among the sympathetic labor struggles have resulted in ignominious and crushing defeat. In the effort to unionize the fields can and will be won without repudiating our solemn contracts with the bituminous operators, provided the bituminous miners will rise to the occasion and do their full duty by their struggling fellow-workers; and with this in mind, I desire to submit for your consideration the following specific recommendations: (1) That the treasurer of the order be directed to appropriate \$50,000 for the relief of the anthracite miners; (2) that the unions appropriate for the same purpose as large a sum as they can afford; (3) that an assessment of \$1 per week be levied on all members of unions; (4) that all officers of the national districts drawing a salary of \$50 a month or over contribute 25 per cent. of their salaries; (5) that an appeal be made to all trade unions and citizens generally to aid the cause of the miners; (6) that no money be raised by the American people be issued, appealing to the American people to bring such pressure to bear as will compel the operators to submit to arbitration. At the conclusion of the convention, an address, a motion was made that the suggestions of Mr. Mitchell be adopted. The speech was greeted with great applause from both anthracite and bituminous miners. President Ryan, of the Illinois miners, at once offered a motion, which was promptly seconded, that the recommendations be adopted. The question was being put, when a delegate rose to ask for information, and then a close debate, which continued until the convention adjourned until 10 a.m. tomorrow.

ONE MINE WORKING.

Wilkesbarre, Pa., July 17.—The Susquehanna Company resumed work at its No. 7 breaker at Northbrook yesterday, announcing that it had sufficient men. They will work the mine daily, they declare, and ship the coal to market.

NO EIGHT-HOUR DAY NOW.

Toronto, July 18.—The miners of America will not at present make a demand for an eight-hour day after May 1, 1903. The motion in favor of an eight-hour day was defeated at yesterday morning's convention. The resolution was arrived at, on the advice of President Fox, to secure first the adoption all over the continent of a nine-hour day. No general strike for the eight-hour day will be made until the question is being put in adjusting wage scales to call for a nine-hour day rather than an advance in wages in the cities where longer hours are now in force.

DREAM OF CECIL RHODES

Opening Up of Dark Continent Is a Reality.

A Railway Will Soon Stretch From Cairo to the Cape.

Washington, July 18.—Before many years the world may be astonished to find that the long-fostered dream of the late Cecil Rhodes for the opening up of the Dark Continent has become a reality, and that a consecutive line of steel rails stretches from Cairo to Cape Town. The state department has just made public the interesting story of a railroad development in Africa from the United States Consul Ravnald at Beirut, bearing date of May 10. The consul says that by agreement signed at Brussels, the previous month, by Robert Williams, with the King of the Belgians, the German route was abandoned, and the railway from Cairo to the Cape is to be built through the Congo Free State to the upper waters of the Nile. From Stanley Falls, on the Upper Congo, a railway is to be built to Mahagi, on Lake Albert Nyanza, and thence through the Congo Free State link between the Cape and Egyptian railways.

Consul Ravnald points out that the railway project does not necessarily replace the original line through German territory, as planned by Mr. Rhodes and the German Government. In fact, he says that it is quite likely, says the consul, "that the railway will be built through the Congo Free State to the upper waters of the Nile. From Stanley Falls, on the Upper Congo, a railway is to be built to Mahagi, on Lake Albert Nyanza, and thence through the Congo Free State link between the Cape and Egyptian railways."

Consul Ravnald says that all maps of Africa show the importance of the route, and that the railway is being made so rapidly and is changing the face of the country so materially.

The consul says that the United States is not playing an important part in the development of Africa, and that "Stanley's momentous work in the seventies has not been followed up by his quondam countrymen." Only by this connection to our commerce of any material importance.

FLUNKED ON A DUEL

A Swedish Military Officer Challenged American and Failed to Show Up.

Stockholm, Sweden, July 18.—A sensation has been caused in military circles here by the conduct of Capt. Arvid Wester, who, after challenging an American, William Casper, to fight a duel, failed to appear at the spot selected for the encounter.

The trouble arose at a performance in the Grand Arena Palace. Wester, who was in uniform, and wearing his decorations, disturbed the scene of a mind reader. Casper, who was in civilian dress, was remonstrated with the captain and demanded an apology. This Wester refused, and Casper then challenged the American, who accepted and repaired to the meeting place at 5 o'clock yesterday morning. Wester, including the secretary of the United States legation (Joseph Muir).

Wester, who was a war correspondent, failed to appear, and, as a consequence, will undoubtedly be forced to retire from the army. Casper has been the recipient of many congratulations.

EIGHTEEN DOLLARS A TON

Secretary John Hay Pays the Record Price for Anthracite Coal.

Lake Sunapee, N. H., July 18.—Secretary of State John Hay has just paid the record price for coal, and it was common, ordinary anthracite coal. Some time ago, when the family opened their summer cottage here, Mrs. Hay found need of a fire to keep warm. There was no coal in the house and she telephoned to the dealer in Windsor, asking him that a ton be sent over at once. As the Hay house is in a rather inaccessible location, the dealer asked how he should send the coal.

"By express," was the order. The coal was sent and the bill has just been paid. It included two items: Coal at Mr. Hay's summer home here; it will be shipped by freight.
