HON. MR. CODERRE TO STEP OUT IS RUMOR ABOUT THE LOBBIES; SUMMER MAY SEE AN ELECTION

Government of Two Minds in Regard to Closure,
Rogers Being Anxious to Ram It Through
and Borden Timid.

MACDONALD CHALLENGES MINISTERS TO TELL THE PERMANENT PROGRAM

Ottawa, March 14.—Three interesting reports are being circulated in the lobbies of Parliament today. One is that Hon. L. P. Coderre, Secretary of State, may resign before the charges are presented against him, and that he will be succeeded in the Government by H. B. Ames, member for St. Antoine. The second is that before Parliament adjourns on Wednesday for the Easter holiday, the Government will give notice of a closure bill. This will not be given with the idea of getting it through the House, though an attempt will be made, but in preparation for an election. Finally, there is a growing belief that dissolution will take place soon after Easter, and a general election take place in May or June.

Government Divided.

On the question of closure and election, it is understood that the Government has two minds, and that they predominate alternately. It is pretty clear that the Rogers group in the ministry does not want to go to the country, as it fears the result, and does not see the need of taking the chance of disaster at the polls. This group wants to ram closure through the House, or to continue to stand the siege of continuous sitting after reply is exhausted, relying on the developments of a feeling of hostility against the Opposition for withholding funds from the public service.

Afraid of Closure.

The Borden group in the Government and behind it in the House do not like the idea of attempting to put the closure into effect while the naval question is an issue. They are willing to take the chance of election, and would prefer to have the issue decided at the polls, rather than in Parliament after closure.

Whatever decision is come to on the question of election the House is certainly going to sit until Wednesday. Early speakers last night were Demers, of Itherville; Lacey, of Itherville, and Lachance, of Quebec. A man was put out of the public gallery for growling too loudly.

Col. Sam Hughes caught Burnham, of Peterboro, smoking his pipe at the back of the chamber and had it suppressed.

Lights Switched Off.

Mr. Martin, of Regina, made a speech in the early morning which stirred things up. He was declaring that the Ontario Conservatives had to be muzzled and gagged because their views on the navy differed so much, when someone turned the lights out. There was a moment of darkness, and Mr. Martin had no sooner resumed than the chamber was plunged into darkness a second time. The chairman directed the sergeant-at-arms to see that this did not occur again.

Mr. Martin was discussing the advantage of having a Canadian fleet when Hon. Mr. Pelletier asked if the ships would be built in Canada. Mr. Pelletier if he did not believe that Canada was capable of constructing ships of any kind. This seemed to start a storm on the Government side and for a few minutes nothing could be heard. It was Col. Sam Hughes, who told Mr. MacDonald to take things easy.

Still No Answer.

"I want to ask the Postmaster-General if the Government has abandoned all thought of providing for Canadian naval defence. Did it hold that Canada could not build cruisers and destroyers, although Australia was now doing this," said Mr. MacDonald.

"The present policy is one of immediate aid to the empire, the balance will come later," said Mr. Pelletier.

"What balance?" said Mr. MacDonald.

"Well, the other part," said Mr. Pelletier.

"What other part?" persisted Mr. MacDonald.

"What is the hon. member talking about?" asked Mr. Pelletier, impatiently. Mr. MacDonald continued to press, and Mr. Pelletier finally said, "The Premier speaks of this as something we were doing now, and intimates that there would be some-

thing else done later under agreement with the admiralty.

Mr. MacDonald continued to press for a statement of what the later program would be and was so persistent that Hon. Martin Burrell had to come to the rescue of his colleague. He said that the announcement would be made by the Premier in due course. "Can any of the four ministers present tell the House and country what the Government intends to do," asked Mr. MacDonald.

ANOTHER SPARLING DYING APPARENTLY AS BROTHER DIED

May Have Important Bearing
on Case of Dr. MacGregor,
Now in Prison.

Symptoms Declared To Be the
Same as Those Which Pre-
ceded Other's Death.

Developments that may have an important bearing on its ultimate outcome have occurred in the Sparling mystery at Bad Axe, Mich., in which Dr. Robert MacGregor, a former Londoner, is involved. Ray Sparling, another member of the family in which the alleged mysterious deaths occurred, is dying, just as was predicted by Dr. MacGregor when giving evidence on his own behalf.

Predicted Death.

It will be remembered that the plea put forth by Dr. MacGregor in defending himself against a charge of murder was that the Sparlings had died from the excessive use of a patent medicine containing arsenic, which had accumulated in their systems.

He at that time declared that Ray Sparling, a younger member of the family, who had been treated himself with the same medicine, would die within a year.

The prosecuting attorney pointed to the youthful witness, whose death had been predicted, and called the attention of the court to the healthful appearance of the lad, seeking to make capital by the incident.

BALKAN NATIONS NAME CONDITIONS AS TO MEDIATION

Will Insist That Peninsula of
Gallipoli Alone Be Left
Turks.

Sultan Must Accede All Isles
of Aegean Sea and Pay
Indemnity.

Sofia, Bulgaria, March 14.—The reply of the Balkan allies on the question of mediation by the powers was presented today to the foreign legations here. It declares that the Balkan nations will accept European mediation in following conditions:

First—As a basis of negotiations for the delimitation of the territory between Turkey and Balkan allies a line shall be drawn from Rodosto on the Sea of Marmora to Cape Malakra, seven miles south of Midia on the Black Sea, excluding the Peninsula of Gallipoli, which shall remain to Turkey. All territories west of the line, including Adrianople and Scutari, shall be ceded by Turkey to the allies.

Second—Turkey shall cede the islands in the Aegean Sea to the allies.

Third—Turkey shall renounce all her interests in the Island of Crete.

Fourth—The Porte shall consent in principle to the payment of a war indemnity, the amount of which shall be fixed when peace has been concluded, and also to the payment of private individuals as compensation for damage caused prior to the war. The allies shall participate in the deliberations regarding the indemnities.

Fifth—The allies reserve the right to settle by definite treaty of peace the principle to the payment of a war indemnity, and to their trade in the Ottoman Empire, as well as the guarantees to be given regarding the privileges of the Orthodox churches and the legal standing of their racial brothers who are Ottoman subjects.

The military operations shall not be interrupted.

NOISE AT WINDOW MAN CALLS POLICE CAUGHT BURGLAR

Richmond Street North Resi-
dent Has Exciting Experience
at Early Hour.

Surprisingly Officers Steal
to Rear of House and
Make Arrest.

Waking from his peaceful slumbers at 3 o'clock this morning, a resident of Richmond street north heard the unmistakable sounds of burglars trying to force an entrance by way of a back window. He listened. Yes, there could be no mistake. The thugs did not seem to care how much noise they made. There was a scraping and scratching, accompanied by dull thuds as from a muffled hammer.

Excitement at Headquarters. Springing from bed the householder stealthily made his way to the telephone and informed the police.

Instantly all was bustle at the Carling street station. Several officers were dispatched to the address given, fully armed and prepared to battle with desperate criminals. They were quickly but quietly admitted to the house. So skillfully were all these details carried out that the burglar was not disturbed at his work. The ominous sounds continued at intervals.

Preparations to effect his arrest were made. The officers advanced to the window, taking advantage of all possible cover to protect them from the possible bullets of their quarry.

Caught in the Act. Meanwhile a large pet rabbit struggled on the windowsill to extricate himself from the entanglements of the window screen. He had managed to get in between the screen and the window, but his efforts to get out were unavailing.

He thumped the sill with his powerful hind-legs, and called the attention of the officers to the gallant bluecoats. He was released, and peace and quietness reigned once more in the home where a moment before consternation and terror had held sway.

FORMER LONDON MAN KILLED AT BUFFALO

John De Fields Struck by a Pile
Driver and Had Spine
Fractured.

Mrs. Ben. Johnston, of 83 Maple street, received word Monday evening that her brother-in-law, John De Fields, a former Londoner, had been instantly killed in Buffalo, and left at once for that city. Mr. De Fields was

working around a pile-driver, when a cable snapped and allowed the heavy hammer to fall some feet, it struck him in the back, fracturing the spine and causing instant death.

Mr. De Fields resided in London and London Township for many years. His wife, to whom he was married a couple of years ago, was Miss Stewart, daughter of Mrs. Stewart, of 446 Ridout street. Another sister resides in Idaho. The funeral will be held in Buffalo and Mrs. Johnston is attending.

HYDRO REJECTS CLAIM OF CITY FOR LIGHTING

Stated at the City Hall That
the Same Rate Must
Be Paid.

Appeal From Charge of \$30,-
000 Bears No Result For
London.

It was reported on good authority this morning that the hydro-electric commission had turned down the appeal of the city against the hydro-electric department's street lighting rates. The rates will be the same as for 1912, viz., \$11 per 75-watt 60-candlepower lamp, \$12.85 per 100-watt 80-candlepower lamp, and \$8 per lamp for lamps placed at half-distances, totalling up, as last year, to \$29,200, in round numbers.

General Manager Glaubitz had not received any notification of the failure of the city's appeal this morning, but a report was received from Toronto to that effect.

GRAND RIVER ON SPRING RAMPAGE

The Basements in the Lower
Section of Galt Are
Flooded.

ICE CAME WITH RUSH
In Attempt to Save His Horses Young
Man Narrowly Escapes
Drowning.

Galt, March 14.—The annual spring freshet of the Grand River came down at 8 o'clock this morning. The basements of the majority of the buildings on the east side of the river in the lower portion of the town were flooded, and considerable damage to household effects was caused. The heaviest losses, however, will be the C. Turnbull Knitting Company. The ice smashed through the lower windows and great pieces were swirled in among the machinery, racks and goods. No accurate estimate of the damage here can be made at the present time. Several other industries located along the bank will be out of commission for a couple of days, owing to the machinery being stopped as a result of the flood.

Lost a Horse. J. Hunt, Water street north, lost a horse. When the water first began to rise, his son James led one of the two animals in the barn out to safety, but in his attempt to rescue the second he was thrown from his feet and only saved himself from drowning by grabbing the clothesline and pulling himself up to higher ground. The horse was caught in the current and carried down stream. The water flooded over on to Water street south, and the East River road is blocked with huge pieces of ice from the overflowing river. Fortunately the water remained at its height for only a short time, and this was a great factor in lessening the damage, which otherwise would have been wrought.

The fire department was called out to remove Mrs. Munroe, an old invalid lady, who lives at a low part of Water street, but although the water was a foot deep in her dining-room it was not necessary to take her out.

Employees and factory owners will lose much on account of the loss in operation of the river-side plants.

LONDON PHYSICIANS AT FRIEDMAN CLINIC

Members of Western Medical
Faculty Attending the
Toronto Test.

Toronto, March 14.—Members of the medical faculty from the Western University at London were conspicuous at the gathering of physicians today, and several prominent physicians came to the city from Western Ontario points to have a chance to see the celebrated physician, Dr. Friedman.

Delighted With Canadians. Asked regarding his experiences in Canada, Dr. Friedman said that he was delighted with his reception in Montreal and Ottawa. "I was afforded every opportunity to demonstrate my cure," he said, "and that is all I ask. The cases presented for treatment were of nearly every form of tuberculosis, and the doctors present should be expected to take a different attitude. Dr. Friedman is treating hundreds of poor sufferers without any charge whatever, and he should not be accused of being mercenary."

Dr. Friedman to go to London with him this afternoon and conduct a clinic in one of the hospitals there, but the doctor said that he regretted having to decline the invitation to "I must be in New York tomorrow morning," said Dr. Friedman.

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
