Lucas and a few other bird-loving friends bought an estate in the "broads" district of Norfolk before the war and turned it into a sanctuary for rare local birds with appreciable success. One feature of this refuge waz the return of breeding bitterns to Norfolk, and their steady increase is regarded as one of the most heartening chapters in recent bird history.

Sanctuaries of wild life require a vigilant eye and often a controlling hand. The worst of all ehemies of rare British birds is the collector of their eggs. When the last half-dozen British kites were preserved from extinction in Mid-Wales the nest terees had literally to be watched day and night. Bird and animal pests may be only less destructive than human raiders. A bird sanctuary if uncontrolled may simply become a happy hunting-ground of jays, crows, stoats, weasels, rats, sparrows, stoats, mongooses, or whatever ofther species may be artificially in the ascendant. These sanctuaries need not only be formed, but maintained.



or France would be inevitable.

Partly on this account, but mainly for the reason of the vigorous representations put forward by the domin-ion delegates at the imperial confer-ence, the garrisons will be maintained in Egypt until good and sufficient guarantees are forthcoming in regard to the safety to communications with-in the British commonwealth.

Treaty To Be Published. Documents, including the treaty as proposed by the British Government, and Sir Adly's reply will shortly be published in full. Meantime the capital that Zaghlul Pasha had hoped to make out of the rupture in the negotiations has proved negligible His recent tour and the manner in which his appeal was made to the native mind has caused him to suffer con siderable discredit at the hands of numbers of his former supporters.

Many members of the legislative assembly have publicly withdrawn the mandate which Zaghlul Pasha had formerly enjoyed, and have declared openly that Sir Adly's administration is worthy of full support. Whether Sir Adly put his threat to resign the premiership into practice or not, it is considered that Zaghlul Pasha has practically destroyed all his chances of being elected prime minister. In official circles sincere hope is ex-


