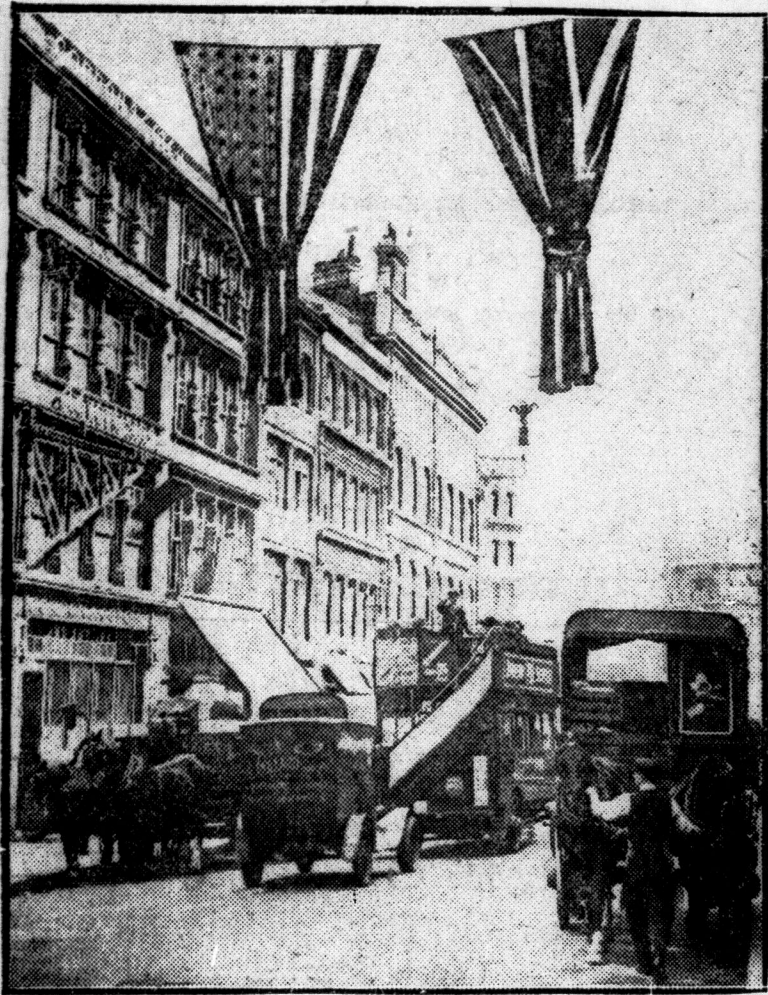

When London paid its respects to the memory of the late President Harding, U. S. flags draped in mourning were much in evidence.



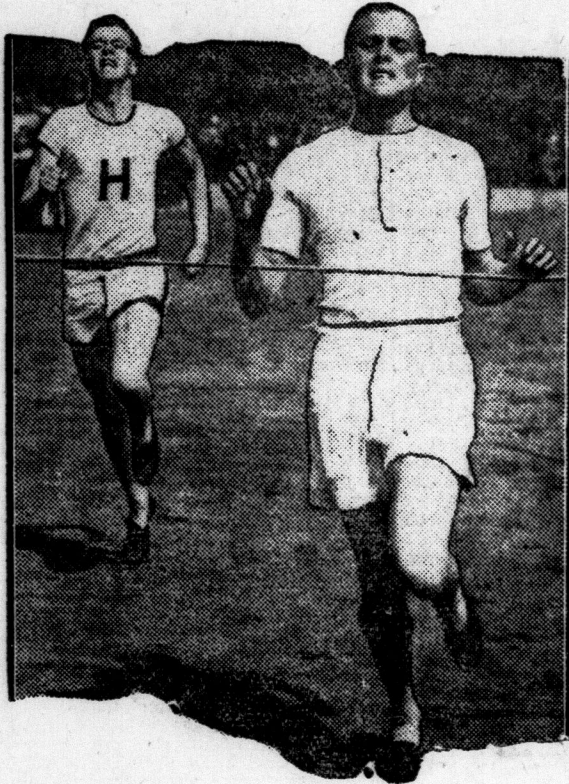

C. E. Davis, Cambridge, wins mile from J. N. Watters, Harvard, by 3 yards in international varsity contest.



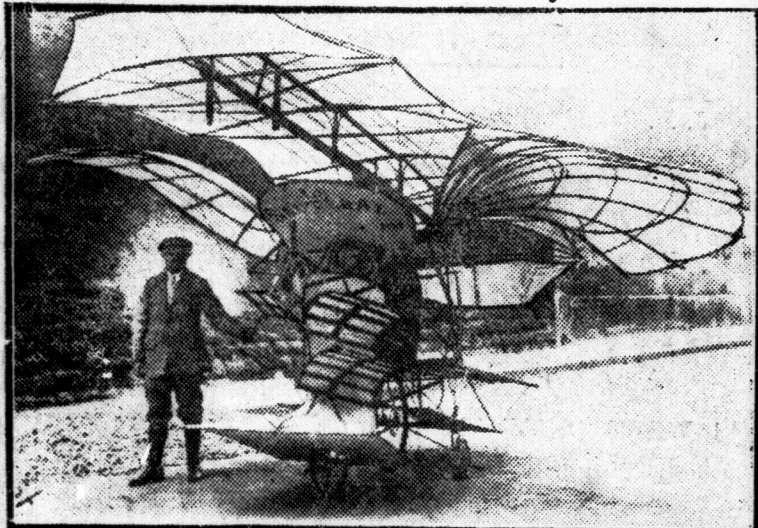
Dr. L. Alter, Polish commissioner of immigration, returns home from American tour.

Weaker sex has heaviest task here; tea garden workers weighing the leaves in picturesque Japan.



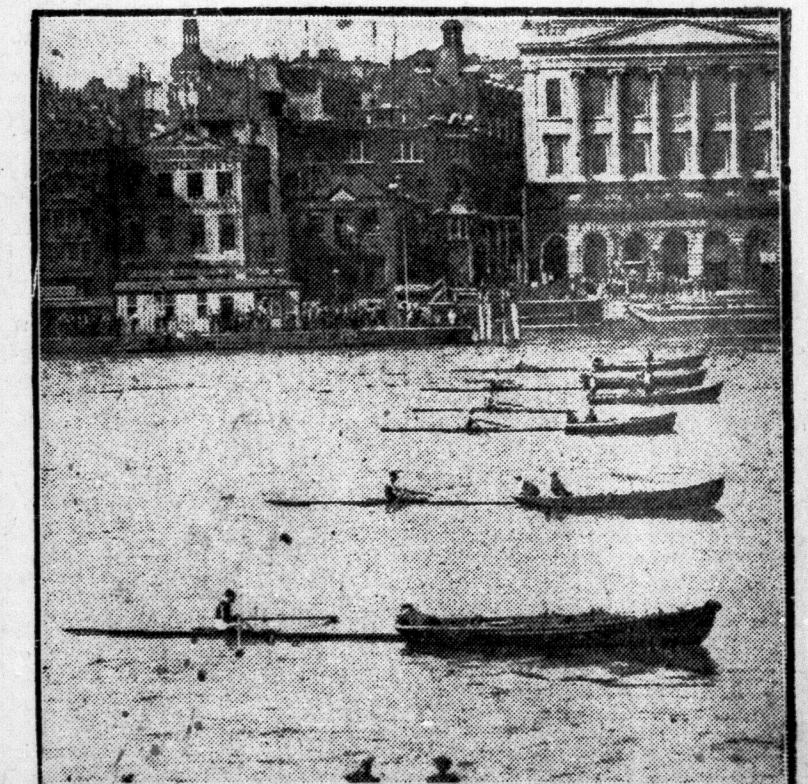
"Rags" is his name, and he has made quite a hit with antics in the movies. Here he is all dressed up for one of his parts.
