OFF TO SIBERIA!
A Russian General Officer Sent to Siberia for Striking and Insulting His Superior.
LONDON, Dec. 21.—Information has been received here that the Czar has confirmed the sentence of five years' penal servitude, loss of rank and orders and exile to Siberia recently passed by a court-martial at Warsaw upon Gen. Reisenkamp, who was convicted on a charge of striking and insulting his superior, Gen. Swistunow. The conviction and disgraced general has a number of friends and relatives who have visited him and visited the States a few years ago. The case has excited the greatest interest throughout Russia. Gen. Reisenkamp is commander of a Division in the Fifty army corps, which is stationed in the Caucasus, under the command of the late autocrat the late Emperor Alexander II.
