ALICE WILL HAVE TO PAY.

A rather singular case disposed of at Osgoode Hall—Not Liable to Term Some Women "Devils".
In Miller v. Wilson, the plaintiff obtained a judgment against C. A. Wilson under the mistaken idea that she was Alice Wilson. They then obtained an order from the Master in Chambers, which was affirmed by Falconbridge, J., allowing them to amend, setting aside the judgment against C. A. Wilson, and making Alice Wilson, trading under the firm name of The North Ender Publishing Co. the defendant. G. M. Mills, for the defendant Alice Wilson, now appeared from the order to the ground that no fraud being shown it should not have been made. The Q.B.D. Court (Armour, C.J., and Street, J.) dismissed the appeal with costs. George Kilmer for defendant.

Where Suresties are Not Liable.
School Trustees v. Waterford v. Clark, assignee of Becker, Mr. Justice Street has decided in favor of the defendant in this case. One Slight, on Jan. 15, 1895, was appointed secretary-treasurer of the plaintiffs for the ensuing year on his giving the necessary security. Slight procured the execution of a bond by Becker and another as his sureties, the condition being that he should be faithful in his duties and accounting for moneys coming to his hands, but without limitation as to the time the sureties were to be liable and reference to the fact that Slight was appointed for a year only. No other bond was ever given, but that was not a condition each year thereafter and for one year at a time up to 1894, in which year he made default for which amount the plaintiffs ask payment. The learned judge holds that the sureties are not liable, there being no clause in the statute under which Slight was appointed which declares that a secretary-treasurer shall continue in office until his successor is appointed, even if that would help. He distinguishes this case from *Barlow v. U.C.P. 178*, and *Adams v. McElroy, 9 O.R. 580*, *Wilkes, Q.C.* for plaintiffs, *Cassidy, Q.C.* for defendant. In *Brown v. Steele, Armour, C.J.*, has given judgment in appeal by plaintiff from report of local master at Brampton. Amount in executors' hands is found by him at \$11,750.00, and compensation \$265.55. In other respects appeal dismissed. Blain (Brampton) for plaintiff, Stonehouse (Brampton) for defendant.

The case of *McGraw v. Preston* has been fixed for trial at Kingston on Monday, 16th Dec, next.
