ALICE WILL HAVE TO PAY.

A Rather Singular Case Disposed of Osgoode Hall—Not Libelous to Term Some Women "Devils,"

Osgoode Hall, Nov. 26, 1895. In Miller v. Wilson the plaintiffs obtained a judgment against C. A. Wilson under the mistaken idea that she was Alice Wilson. They then obtained bushels; Nov. 16, 1895, 2,176,972 bushels; norder from the Master in Chambers, Nov. 24, 1894, 642,972 bushels. tained a judgment against C. A. Wilan order from the Master in Chambers, which was affirmed by Falconbridge, allowing them to amend, setting aside the judgment against C. A. Wilson, and making Alice Wilson, trading under the firm name of The North Ender Publishing Co. the defendant. G. G. Mills, for the defendant Alice Wilson, now appealed from the order on the ground that no fraud being shown it should not have been made. The Q.B.D. Court (Armour, C.J., and Street, J.,) dismissed the appeal with costs. George Kilmer for defend-

In Cannon v. Orr, the plaintiff asked the C.P.D. Court (Meredith, C.J., and Rose, J.) for a new trial, Armour, C.J., having, at the trial at Belleville directed a non-suit. Mrs. and Mr. Cannon were employed by the defendant, and after leaving him, the plaintiff alleged that he wrote to her husband accusing her of theft and exhorting the husband to make restitution and calling the plaintiff a "devil" as well as threatening to prosecute her. The court held that the letter was privileged; that there was no evidence of express malice and that defendant himself honestly believed the theft had been committed. They dismissed the motion with costs. E. G. Porter (Belleville) for plaintiff. Clute, Q.C., for defendant.

Where Surcties are Net Liable.

School Trustees of Waterford v. Clarkson, assignee of Becker, Mr. Jus-In Cannon v. Orr, the plaintiff asked the C.P.D. Court (Meredith, C.J.,

School Trustees of Waterford v. Clarkson, assignee of Becker. Mr. Justice Street has decided in favor of the defendant in this case. One Slaght, on Jan. 15, 1890, was appointed secretary-treasurer of the plaintiffs for the ensuing year on his giving the necessary security. Slaght procured the execution of a bond by Becker and another as his sureties, the condition being the faithful performance of his duties and accounting for moneys comduties and accounting for moneys coming to his hands, but without limitation as to the time the sureties were to be liable and without reference to the fact that Slaght was appointed for a year only. No other bond was ever given, but Slaght was re-appointed each year thereafter and for one year at a time up to 1894, in which year he made the default for which amount the plaintiffs ask payment. The learned judge holds that the sureties are not liable. There is no clause in the statute under which Slaght was appointed which declares that a secretary-treasurer shall continue in office until his successor is appointed, even if that would help. 

On sawlogs \$1.25 per thousand feet board measure; on square or wanny timber \$25 per thousand feet cubic. No pine trees of a less diameter than seven inches on the stump shall be cut. The Department reserves all timber except the pine, together with the right to dispose of such other timber at any time, and purchasers of the other timber will have the right to cut the same and to make roads and do whatever may be necessary in the premises to cut and remove the same.

Terms of payment: One-half cash, balance in three and six months with interest at seven per cent; notes for balance to be endorsed by parties satisfactory to the Department. A marked cheque for two hundred dollars must accompany each tender. The highest or any tender not necessarily accepted.




