In her opinion, however, there is no better way in which they can be cooked than to bake them atter the method set down in the following reprise. Pour two tablescoorfule of arter the method set down in the following recipe: Pour two tablespoonfuls of
the purest olive oil into a baking dish.
Add four tablespoonsfuls of grated bread
crumbs that have talready been mixed
with parsley and other herbs, all of which
must have been chopped very fine. Season with pepper and salt. Upon this
bed of oil and crumbs lay a dozen tomatoes that have been cut in halves. Cover
them with four more tablesproporative of them with four more tablespoonsfuls of bread crums that have previously been seasoned in the same way. Pour over all two more tablespoonfuls of oil and send the dish to a hot oven, where the tomatoes must bake for about one hour.—The Delineator for April.


