THE 'STABBING' AFFAIR.

Never in our recollection has such wide-spread excitement existed in Bridgetown, as pervaded our community, during the time that intervened between the night on which Mr. McLean received his deadly wound, and the day his murderer was captured.

But, whilst I see striking manifestations of the worst traits, I rejoice to witness some of the best features of the human nature, brought out in connection with this sad affair. I see this whole community aroused to righteous indignation against the murderer, and putting forth every effort to bring him to justice.

As I stood by the side of that dying man the other day, I saw that he was in the valley of the shadow of death, trembling because of the memory of his sins, and I heard him in anguish cry to God for mercy.

In the meantime the search for the murderer continued incessantly. Report after report kept coming in as to his whereabouts, and every one was followed up faithfully, but without success until Saturday afternoon, when almost by a chance a man named McIntyre arrested him on Moore River bridge, but of this anon.

Friday was the day of the funeral. By the afternoon train, three of the Mr. McLean's brothers arrived—one, Mr. T. A. McLean, well known to many in this town, as he was a resident in our midst for some time, several years ago.

My dear friends, we are called together on this occasion, under the most solemn and sad circumstances. Death, under the most alleviating circumstances, casts a gloom upon the feelings, but we will express our feelings on such an occasion as the present.
