Northwest Missions.

THE Home Mission Committee of the Presbyterian Synod of Manitoba and the Northwest met on 24th and 25th last in Knox church. There were present, Rev. Dr. Robertson, convener, Revs. Dr. King, Dr. Bryce, Mesus. S. C. Murray, J. E. Munro, D. Munro, R. Frew, C. W. Gordon, J. A. Carmichael, H. C. Sutherland, W. G. W. Fortune and J. Farquharson, clerk. A large part of the business was the consideration of grants for the half year ending with this month. The amounts given to the several Presbyteries were as follows: Presbytery of Superior, \$298; of Winnipeg, \$1,491.50; Rock Lake, \$578; Glenboro, \$104; Portage la Prairie, \$566; Brandon, \$182; Minnedosa, \$2,035; Melita, \$1,114; Regina, \$3,003.50; total, \$9,282. The Committee recommended the appointment of ten missionaries to the THE Home Mission Committee of the Presthe appointment of ten missionaries to the mission fields; and it was found that thirteen mission fields; and it was found that unificen more would still be required for the Synod. The appointments will be finally made by the General Assembly's Home Mission Committee, which will meet in Toronto on the 8th of October. The Committee also arranged for the travelling expenses of student missionaries returning from their fields of labor to the colleges. to the colleges.

AUGMENTATION COMMITTEE.

The Augmentation Committee of the Synod, also met at the same time. The members are the same as those of the Home Mission Committee, with Rev. Peter Wright, of Portage la Prairie, as convener. The Committee recommended grants to be made to the several Presbyteries for the half year closing this month, as follows: Winnipeg Presbytery, \$237; Rock Lake, \$129.70; Glenboro, \$75; Brandon, \$100; Minnedoza, \$300; Melita, \$116; Regina, \$104; total, \$1,151.70. The Committee also recommended that grants for the ensuing year be made to the Presbyteries as follows: Winnipeg, \$412.50; Rock The Augmentation Committee of the Sy-

Lake, \$306; Glenboro, \$125; Brandon, \$275; Minnedosa, \$280; Melita, \$166.50; Regina, \$156; total, \$1,721. Five congregations have become self-sustaining during the half year, and one was added to the list of augmented congregations.
