

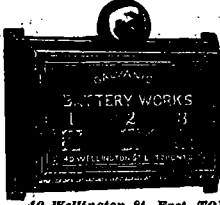
The Vancouver Lime Co., with a capital of \$20,000, seeks incorporation.

It seems that the recent fire in the Federal telephone building at Montreal, was caused by a crossbetween high tension electric light wire, and one of the telephone wires. Accidents of this kind only bear out our contention that companies operating high tension lighting circuits should be compelled to use properly insulated wire for the work instead of the cheap grades that are now being so commonly used.

Now that incandescent electric lights are being so much introduced into private residences, where concealed wiring is usually insisted on, electricians should not lose sight of the fact that while a properly wired house is a perfectly safe fire risk, still the least imperfection in the concealed work is only too liable to develop into a continual source of danger, and for this reason work of this kind should be always laid out and superintended by none other than a thoroughly competent and experienced electrician.

Tenders will not be considered unless made on the form supplied and signed with the actual signatures of tenders.

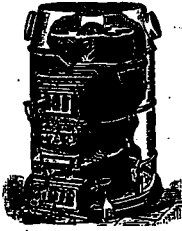

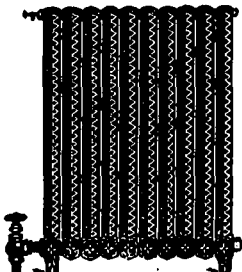
