other country's school health services and exchanging technology with regard to the promotion of health education. These visits could take place beginning in 1985.

The names and curricula vitae of the officials concerned, the dates and durations of their visits, and other available details will be made known through diplomatic channels.

The Canadian side took note of this wish, and indicated that as soon as it received the programmes of activities that the Mexican officials wished to carry out, it would forward them to the corresponding institutions.

12. The SEP's Dirección General de Educación Inicial [Primary School Education Branch] is interested in having two Mexican researchers visit Canada for a period of up to two weeks for the purpose of studying the workings of certain Canadian centres that promote early learning. This visit could be made at any time from May 1984 onwards.

In reciprocity, the SEP would receive two Canadian researchers to examine the advances that have been made in Mexico in the area of primary education.

The Canadian side took note of this proposal and indicated that it would convey it to the corresponding institutions.

Available details will be made known through diplomatic channels.
