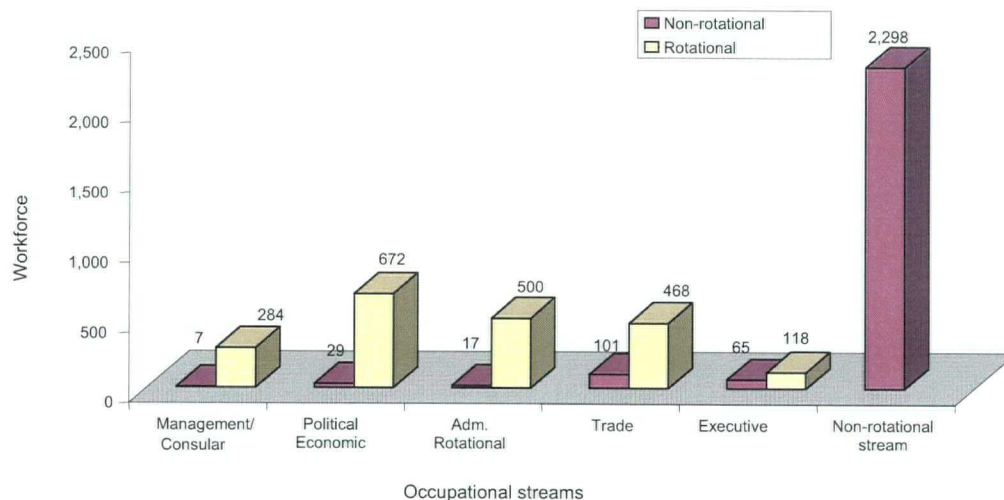


Chart 13 illustrates the breakdown in the workforce by employment category and occupational stream:

- If we exclude the non-rotational occupational stream, the highest numbers of non-rotational employees are found in the Trade and Executive streams. Within these streams, non-rotational employees account for 18% and 36%, respectively, of the workforce. However, this stream generally applies to term employees because, typically, non-rotational employees belong to the non-rotational stream.

1.3.7 Breakdown of the workforce by status and occupational group

Table 4 illustrates the breakdown of DFAIT's workforce by status and occupational group:

- 4,269 employees, accounting for 93.6% of the workforce, were active as of March 31, 2006. The remainder were on leave without pay (231 or 5.1%) or seconded to another organization (59 or 1.3%). Chart 14 provides a visual representation of this breakdown.
- The proportion of active employees is similar across the occupational groups. However, the ES and IS groups have a higher proportion of employees on unpaid leave compared with the average for the Department as a whole (9.6% versus 5.1%). Furthermore, the FS group has more employees on secondment compared with the Department as a whole (2.9% versus 1.3%).
