- Mr. Marcel Roy (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Industry, Trade and Commerce): Export Development Corporation states: 1. The Export Development Corporation's Export Credits Insurance Division does not grant credits; it does insure for exporters risks of non-payment for credits granted by exporters. It has written such insurance for exports to Chile since 1970. (a) Information as to the credit extended by exporters relating to EDC's insurance is received by EDC from them as confidential information and may not be published without the consent of the exporters concerned; (b) As indicated in the foregoing there is no borrower in such transactions and EDC may not disclose without the consent of the exporters, the names of buyers to whom the exporters extended credit; (c) Please see Part 1 (b); (d) As indicated in the foregoing it is the exporter who provides financing in such cases and EDC's information thereon is received as confidential information. From 1970 to 1975 EDC insured exports to Chile on which EDC's contingent liability was an aggregate of \$8.8 million.
- 2. By tradition and as a matter of commercial principle Crown Corporations have not been required by Parliament to answer detailed questions on their administration and operations. In certain instances an announcement may be made when an export sale supported by EDC has been finally consummated. Those transactions appear in EDC's Annual Report.
