Your Committee recommend that Mr. A. B. Hannay be appointed for the next Session of Parliament, upon the reporting staff of the Senate, to be paid at the rate of forty dollars (\$40) per week, with the understanding, however, that his services may be dispensed with at any time during the Session upon one week's notice given to him.

His services to be: To attend Standing and Special Committees of the Senate, and prepare a concise synoptical report of the discussion and proceedings in each of them; and have the same placed in the hands of the press reporters (newspapers correspondents) for early use.

Also, to prepare a concise synopsis of the Debates of the Senate, during the progress of the Debate, and have the same ready to be handed to the press reporters not later than one hour after the rising of the Senate, in the afternoon. In case the Senate should sit in the evening, then the said synopsis of the evening Debate shall be delivered to the press reporters not later than one hour aftr the rising of the Senate.

Also, that he may have a seat at the Table or as may be arranged between His Honour the Speaker and the Chairman of the Committee.

Your Committee also recommend that Mr. E. E. Cinq Mars be appointed for the next Session as translator upon the reporting staff of the Senate; for the purpose of supplying the correspondents of all newspapers published in French with a correct synopsis of the Senate Debates as that supplied to the English publications.

Your Committee further recommend that he be paid at the rate of fifteen (\$15 dollars a week, when the Senate is sitting and that it be understood that his services may be dispensed with at any time during the session upon one week's notice given to him.

Your Committee also recommend that in accordance with the report of your Committee as adopted by the Senate yesterday, the Messieurs Holland Brothers be notified that the present arrangement is limited to the work of next Session, at the end of which Session it will be discontinued.

All which is respectfully submitted.
