"summoning the present Parliament of "Canada, until a Speaker of the House of "Commons shall have been chosen, according "to law; but, to-morrow, at the hour of three "o'clock in the afternoon, His Excellency will "declare the causes of his calling this Parliament."

Governor or Deputy retires.

His Excellency (or the Deputy Governor) retires first, then the Commons. M. 152-3; B. 88-89.

Adjournment of Senate. 11. As there is nothing now before the Chair, the Speaker usually requests the Leader, or the senior member, to move the adjournment. When the Senate is to meet at any other time than three o'clock p.m., being the hour appointed by Rule 7, the following motion must first be put, thus:

"It is moved by the Honourable Senator...,
"seconded by the Honourable Senator...,
"that when the Senate adjourns this day, it
"do stand adjourned until to-morrow, at
"half-past two o'clock in the afternoon.
"Those who are in favour of the motion will
"say 'Content'; those who are against it will
"say 'Not Content.'—Carried."
