Dear Sir Arthur, I have your letter of the 14th instant in regard to the time of the lectures on "Cases on Negotiable Instruments" by Professor Mackay. I note what you say and will take the matter up with Professor Sugars. Don't you think, however, that the point that came up incidentally (I mean the fact that the Law people have their lectures begin on the half hour while other Faculties begin on the hour) indicates the desirability of there being an Administrative Board that would have supervision over matters that concern all the Faculties? I have in mind such things as lecture time schedules, examination schedules and so on. I believe that a more centralized control would be good for the whole University in which, up to the present time, the various Faculties seem to have gone pretty much their own way. Such a Committee might consist of the Deans of the Faculties and such other persons as you would think desirable to add.
