beginning and which has the public confidence - the Montreal Health Survey Committee.

The Committee would not become an operating agency, but would limit itself to securing the development of the Department of Health. Through published statements, it would keep the public informed as to action or lack of action on the Survey recommendations. It would keep these recommendations alive. It would, by means of publications and lectures, and in other ways, secure popular interest in and support for health measures and health expenditures. The Health Survey should be repeated in a few years to measure progress and to re-consider Montreal's health problems. A budget of under \$10,000, a year would be adequate.

## RECONMENDATIONS

Your Directors therefore recommend:

- 1. That the Montreal Health Survey Committee be asked to continue to function along the lines indicated.
- 2. That, in the light of the facts as set out, the Health League be permitted to describe attended of the picture. Having some into existence for the purpose of arousing public interest in health work, and so promoting the development of the municipal department of health, the Health League today finds that the desired public interest is aroused, that there exists, through the Survey, a health programme for Montreal, and that the Montreal Health Survey Committee, which the League invited to function, is best able to do what remains to be done as regards securing action on its report. Therefore, your directors recommend that, not because the work is done, but because, on account of changing conditions, the work can be well handled otherwise, the Montreal Anti-Puberdulosis and General Health League surrender its charter and bring its activities to a close.
