

Our debt has thus been reduced from over \$800 to about \$300; pew rent to the amount of \$130 having been previously appropriated to that purpose.

Our Sunday School at Cape Cove has been in operation as usual during the summer and fall months, under the same teachers and with equally good results as last year.

Our three daily schools have, through the kind aid of the two societies—Church Society and Continental—been constantly open. Two of these are very creditable schools and are satisfactory in every respect. The third is badly attended, partly through the removal of children from the place, but chiefly from the insuperable apathy of parents, and is not so satisfactory as the others.
