XV.—The Librarian shall keep an exact Catalogue of the Books, to be open at all times to the Subscribers; but it shall not be taken out of the Library. Subscribers will be furnished with printed Catalogues, upon application to the Librarian, and paying for the same.

XVII.—Any book or set of books, or the leaf of a book, whether blank or printed, that may be torn, damaged, or defaced by drawing or writing upon it, or otherwise injured in the hands of a Proprietor or Subscriber, becomes his, and must be paid for double the value with that of the set to which it belongs; and it is incumbant on every person to take care that the book is in good order before he takes it out, as he will be deprived the use of the Library until this rule is complied with.

XVIII.—That so long as Subscribers shall, through any cause whatever, keep a book or books in their possession, belonging to his Library, beyond the time subscribed and paid for, they shall be deemed Subscribers, and pay accordingly.

XIX.—To prevent disappointment and delay, Subscribers and Proprietors are to send a list of ten or twelve numbers taken from the Catalogue, of such books as they want, under their initials or signature.

XX.—When books are returned, they shall be delivered into the hands of the Librarian, in order that he may examine whether they have been injured or not.
