GRAND CIRCUIT AT CLEVELAND FINE TRACK AND FAST TIME

CLEVELAND, July 30.—The second poolroom of the Cleveland Driving Park began to-day, and the circuit campaigners were greeted by a fairly large crowd. A fine track and bright day added to the general interest.
