The United States Government August crop report indicates condition of spring wheat as 96.5, corn 87, oats 84.2.

The report suggests a corn yield of 1, 986,000,000 bush, a wheat yield of 607,000,000 bush and an oats crop of 660,000,000. This is 77,000,000 bushels more wheat than was raised last year, 84,000,000 bushels more corn and 38,000,000 bushels less oats.

The Chicago Daily Trade Bulletin has a telegram from Minneapolis estimating the spring wheat crop of Minnesota and the two Dakotas at from 240 to 250 million bushels.
