THE CONTEST IN TORONTO.


Beyond the fact that the city postmen were walking their rounds with their tongues hanging out, there was nothing to indicate to the voter that an election was in progress.

NO PROHIBITORY LAW

Cities and Towns of the Country are Decidedly Against It-Quebec Province as a Whole is Against It and Ontario is Not Enamored of It.

The crux of the issue lies in these points: 1. The onus was on the prohibitionists to show that a majority of the entire electorate of Canada was in favor of prohibition.

2. No administration or party would for a moment assume the responsibility of introducing such a law if one of the greater provinces, or a group of the smaller ones, had declared against it.

3. No administration or party would assume the responsibility of introducing such a law when the cities and towns of the country had almost in their entirety declared against it.

4. We live in Canada under a system of responsible government. A system also of party government.

5. As for the discredited Mall, it had no courage. It sought to make a little cheap political capital at the expense of the Liberals.

6. Our truly good fellow-countrymen down in Nova Scotia are very much in favor of prohibition.

7. High pressure continues from the lakes to the Atlantic, but whilst it is increasing in Eastern Canada, a general decrease is taking place over the lakes, owing, in the lake district, to the development of a low arch over the north shore of Lake Superior.
