Whites Go Out Armed and Destroy the Office of the Negro Newspaper, the Press, Even Ministers Join in the Mob-Late Report Says Eight Persons Have Been Killed—More Trouble is Expected

Wilmington, N. C., Nov. 10.—The negroes not having complied with the demand of the business men by 7.30 this morning, the time fixed, a column of 600 armed whites assembled at the corner of Market and Fifth streets, and at 8.30 o'clock marched to the office of The Daily Record, the negro newspaper, and destroyed all material found in the building.

As a result of the trouble at Brookline it is believed that the number of negroes who were killed will number four. A white man named Mayo, who was shot in the stomach, has since died. Another negro in the crowd was shot in the head at the scene of the trouble now.

Eight Negroes Killed. A later despatch to the Star says: Between 8 and 9 o'clock there were several killings. The total casualties at 2 p.m. were eight negroes killed, two wounded and three negroes in the hospital.
