### Robbers Secured \$50,000

#### Kept an Express Messenger Quiet While They Went Thru the Safe.

#### CONFEDERATE IN PASSENGER CAR

#### Argued With Conductor Till the Train Stopped, Then the Three Fled.

El Paso, Texas, July 24.—A daring hold-up took place on the Mexican Central at about 12:30 o'clock Tuesday morning just after the train had left Bernalillo. At that point three Americans boarded the train, two securing themselves on the blind baggage car and the other entering the third-class coach. As soon as the train pulled out the two riding on the outside entered the express car, and covering Messenger Buckner with their revolvers ordered him to throw up his hands. The messenger offered no resistance. The robbers then went leisurely thru the safe, securing \$50,000 in currency, consigned to the Banco Minero at Chihuahua. They also took what other money packages were in the safe and remained quiet until the train stopped, making a hasty exit and dropping off the train before it stopped. They then disappeared into the darkness. About the time the robbers entered the express car the conductor of the train became engaged in an altercation with a passenger who refused to pay his fare. Finally the conductor had the train stopped and the passenger was ejected. The robbers alighted at the same time. It is now believed the troublesome passenger was a partner of the robbers and that his actions were a ruse to secure the stoppage of the train.

New York, July 24.—There was an advance in the retail price of anthracite coal to-day to \$8 a ton, for all sizes. This is an increase of 50 cents to the users of domestic sizes and of 75 cents a ton to the users of steam sizes.

### BUILDING BYLAWS A FARCE.

#### Ald. Richardson Expresses That Opinion to Board of Control.

The Board of Control yesterday received a letter from Ald. Richardson, chairman of the Property Committee, urging that the proposed investigation of the City Commissioner's Department be proceeded with at once. The alderman's letter concluded as follows:

"The verdict of the jury at the inquest in respect to the cause of death of the five deceased women is such that neither the Board of Control nor the Council can quietly look on and not act; something must be done. That our building bylaws and inspection of buildings under Mr. Catesworth are simply a farce, I think by this time every member of the Board of Control and Council has ample proof."

Mr. Catesworth was present to make explanations regarding some accounts of the cattle market which Ald. Richardson had refused to sign. The matter will be further considered to-day.

### Slaughtered 2000 Sheep.

#### Unexplained Lawlessness of a Band of Masked Men.

Lander, Wyo., July 24.—It is learned that, in addition to killing a Mexican sheep herder, named Sam Galaxoa, and slaughtering several thousand sheep, a band of one hundred and fifty masked men surrounded all the sheep camps and forced the sheep men to abandon their flocks. After killing one herd of 2000 sheep, 25 other herds, amounting to about 85,000 sheep, were driven into the mountains and left to shift for themselves. The sheep men have been threatened with instant death if they go after their flocks. The sheep are now the prey of wild animals and the loss will be very heavy. The scene of the lawlessness is 115 miles west of Lander, in Fremont County. The militia may be called out to protect the sheep men.

### TRADES AND LABOR COUNCIL.

#### Some Objections to Strong Language

By Rev. Mr. Shearer.

A letter was read at last night's meeting of the Trades and Labor Council from the widow of the late Fireman O'Leary, thanking the council for sympathy on the death of her husband.

The Provincial Factory Inspectors were deploring that they were responsible for the non-enforcement of the Factories' Act.

A letter was read from J. G. Shearer of the Lord's Day Alliance, suggesting that the council write to the Minister of Customs, complimenting him on his action in stopping Sunday excursions from the United States to Canada. Those who came from the other side on the excursions were referred to by Mr. Shearer as the "cum of the earth and the epithets, and Delegate Wilson's objection to such language was loudly applauded.

The communication was referred to the delegates to the Lord's Day Alliance. A resolution was passed calling upon the city to place in a good condition a department that will guarantee an efficient inspector of buildings. The recent fire showed without doubt that the building department of Toronto is inefficient, the resignation of the inspector of buildings.

At the next meeting of the council some resolutions will be moved and read at a subsequent meeting will be voted on.

### TWO CAMELS FOR THE ZOO.

Ald. Lamb announces that two camels are to be added to the Riverdale Zoo. One of the animals is of the Arabian and the other of the Bactrian variety, which have been presented to the city thru the generosity of Mr. Frederick Nicholls.

The Arabian camel, arrived here yesterday, and is a splendid and healthy animal, four and one-half years old. It has an excellent pedigree, and will be of great interest to the children owing to the association which it bears with those beautiful old Bible stories of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and the history of the Jewish people.

The Bactrian camel is now en route from Central Asia, where they are used transporting all kinds of goods thousands of miles in the interior of China and Siberia. This animal is a regular one, inasmuch as it has two humps; it is a very hardy creature, and is accustomed to winters similar to what we have in Canada. It is expected to arrive in about five or six weeks.
