"The Canadian Red Cross Society now send every fortnight to each prisoner of war from the Canadian contingents, 19 shillings worth of provisions, 12 pounds bread, 100 cigarettes and one-half pound of tobacco. This is irrespective of any money the

This is irrespective of any money the men may assign from their pay or time to write again and send another men may assign from their pay that their relatives may contribute towards extra parcels."

"Private people may no longer send parcels of food or clothing themselves, but the society will purchase and dispatch food parcels for them to any particular man, with any money contributed. The society will also do its best to carry out any wishes as to the contents of the parcels. These parcels are sent in the name of the subscribers and acknowledged direct to them."

Those poor boys need the personal touch, and that can be given by our following out Regulation No. 2, quoted above. It cannot be repeated too often; let us look at it again.

"The society will purchase and dispatch food parcels for them (private persons) to any particular man, with any money contributed. The society will also do its best to carry out any wishes as to the contents of the par-


