Sudbury Six Swamps
Collingwood 11--2

Northern Wolves, With Injured Players, Give Shipbuilders No Chance in Pastime.

TORONTO, March 11.—By a score of 11 to 2, Sudbury, champions of the Northern Hockey League, defeated Collingwood, O. H. A. intermediate champions, here tonight in a "sudden death" game to see which team would compete for the Allan cup. Two of Sudbury's defence players, Boucher and Langlois, were suffering from injuries at

the outset of the game, and at the end of the second period Langlois had to retire. He has a painfully bruised knee. Collingwood, three times winners of the O. H. A. intermediate series, with a record of only one defeat in the last two seasons, made a poor showing in tonight's contest. Sudbury had scored eight goals before Collingwood succeeded in getting one, at the end of the second period, and the O. H. A. intermediate champions' other goal was obtained at the end of the third period. Sudbury will play the winner of the Granite-Tiger round in the O. H. A. senior championship finals for the Allan cup.

READY FOR BOUT.

Toledo, March 12.—With both contestants down to the stipulated weight of 100 pounds—Jimmy Wilde, lightweight champion of Great Britain, and Frankie Mason of Fort Wayne, Ind., are ready for their 12-round bout at the Coliseum here tonight. Both boxers have been training faithfully here for the bout, and both are pronounced in first-class condition. Last night Mason weighed 107 pounds and Wilde 108. Fighting has been running along about even, but this morning it was announced at the Toledo Athletic Club that Wilde rules a slight favorite. Wilde will draw down \$10,000 for his end of the bout, while Mason accepted \$5,000. Mason is Wilde's senior by two years, the Fort Wayne boy being 30 years old. The height of each is the same, 5 feet 3 inches. Wilde has it over his opponent in reach, measuring 68 inches, while that of Mason is 65 1/2.

TO DECIDE CHAMPIONSHIP.

New York, March 12.—The national ice skating figure championship will be decided here March 19 to 21. It was announced today. The meet will be held under the rules of the International Skating Union of America, and will include solo events for men and women, pair skating, and junior championships.

EIGHT TEAMS TIED.

New York, March 12.—Eight teams were tied last night in the six-day bike race at Madison Square as the Broco-Denver pair, which had one lap lead, were eliminated during the day by injuries to Broco. The teams which had gone 1,660 miles and five laps at the end of the 5th hour, were: Goulet-Magin, Egg-Madden, Coburn-Koskey, Buysse-Speisens, Lang-Chapman, Kaiser-Hill, Godvick-Van Nek, and Dupuy-Hansley. Three teams were four laps back. Bello-Madama, Bowker-Bowker, and Byron-Markay. The record for the 5th hour is 1,884 miles and two laps, made in 1914 by Goulet and Genda.

TO REFEREE WILDE-
FRANKIE MASON GO

Briton and Manager Objected To Record Being Third Man Tonight.

TOLEDO, Ohio, March 11.—Jimmy Wilde, lightweight champion boxer of Great Britain, and Frankie Mason of Fort Wayne, Ind., claimant of the American title, will meet in a twelve-round no-decision bout at the Coliseum tomorrow night. Nearly four thousand seats have been disposed of, a large number going to fans from distant points. Ed Smith, a Chicago newspaper man, will be the third man in the ring. Wilde and his manager, Dave Hughes, objecting to Oliver Record, the official who handled the Willard-Dempsey fight here last July 4. Wilde refused to go on with the local referee in the ring. The weight for the bout is 108 pounds, and both contestants were under that notch when they weighed at the Toledo Athletic Club this afternoon. Both were pronounced by their respective trainers as being in perfect condition.
