

JOINT INDUSTRIAL COUNCIL IS FORMED

Builders and Employees Elect Dr. W. J. Stevenson Chairman.

CONCILIATION BOARD

Will Settle All Disputes Arising Out of Trade—First Item, Painters' Strike.

At a large representative meeting of employers and employees of the different building trades in the city, held Saturday night in the Builders' Exchange, a joint industrial council was formed.

The object of the council will be to act as a board of conciliation for the building trades, and to settle all disputes that may arise between the employers and the employees.

The council is composed of eleven members—five employers and five employees, with Dr. W. J. Stevenson as chairman. The first item to be considered by the council is the settling of the painters' strike.

TO LECTURE DAIRY MEN IN MICHIGAN

R. A. Finn to Give Interesting Talk to Creamery Men.

R. A. Finn, B. S. A. Middlesex County agricultural representative, will address a convention of creamery managers and owners at Lapeer, Mich., next Saturday. A close tab on the dairy situation is being kept by the Middlesex branch of agriculture, and some interesting facts are gleaned and compiled from various sources from time to time.

One of the main reasons why the dairy industry is not facing a bright outlook at the present moment is that the British Government is rationing its people so far as imported dairy products are concerned. The British consumer can buy all the British butter he desires at five shillings a pound, but his ration of imported butter is limited to a supply of imported butter, which retails at about half the price.

Very little Canadian butter is offered on the British market. Danish butter and dairy products from other countries whose money is worth less than the British money, shutting out the Canadian product. An adverse exchange rate enables the New York to purchase a large quantity of Danish butter at lower prices than American butter. For the same reason, Canadian butter is not offered extensively on the British market.

Legislation proposed for the testing of cream so that it will be sold at rates depending on its amount of butterfat is now under consideration by the Provincial Government. It will mean more money for the producer with good cream and less for the producer of inferior cream.

REPORT ON CHURCH UNION SUBMITTED

APRIL FIFTEENTH

No Direct Action Can Be Taken For Two Years Yet.

Annihilation of the Presbyterian and Methodist churches has been discussed for some time in the London Methodist Conference and the London Presbytery. It was announced today by a local minister that no union of churches can possibly come about in almost two years yet. The reason for this is, because the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada meets yearly to discuss such union until a year from the time of the signing of a peace treaty.

In the meantime a committee of members from the Presbyterian and Methodist churches are considering a co-operative plan, whereby churches in both denominations now in the city can join one another and so save the Home Mission Board a considerable sum of money.

This co-operative plan has been tried in Northern Ontario with much success. The churches in the city are considering the plan, which one minister speaking on the subject said, "It is much to be desired. We all think our own religion is the best, but every person is striving for the same end."

RESERVE FORCE OF NON-PERMANENT BATTALIONS IN WESTERN ONTARIO

Old 26th Regiment To Be Known As The Middlesex Light Infantry—System Rearranged by Lieut.-Col. Walter James Brown, Former A. A. G., M. D. No. 1.
