

**20 NEW LOADS AT UNION
TOTAL OF 112 ON MARKET**

Quality of Cattle Good—Butchers'
Firm—Exporters Steady—
Sheep and Lambs Firm.

There were twenty carloads of live stock arrived on the market, besides the exporters left over from Monday's market.

Trade opened up slow, owing to buyers not being willing to pay prices asked by the drovers.

The buyers of export cattle report a heavy shrinkage in past shipments, and lax the blame on the drovers, who bring

their cattle to the market on Saturday night, and Sunday morning feeding instead of Saturday morning feeding. The result was that the cattle in many instances became over-filled and weigh as heavy or heavier than they would have been on the farms. This course purposed by the drovers is, to say the least, not encouraging to the farmer, and is a detriment to the market, but especially the latter. It was stated on the market that two or three of the drovers were going to be prosecuted, and until this mode of feeding the cattle is abandoned by the drovers.

It was also stated that to buy the cattle cheaper to make up for the over-feeding, and consequent shrinkage, and to make up for the extra feed required to maintain the prices paid last week, and this state of affairs caused trade to be very slow, and the quoted daily market export steers was \$5.30.
