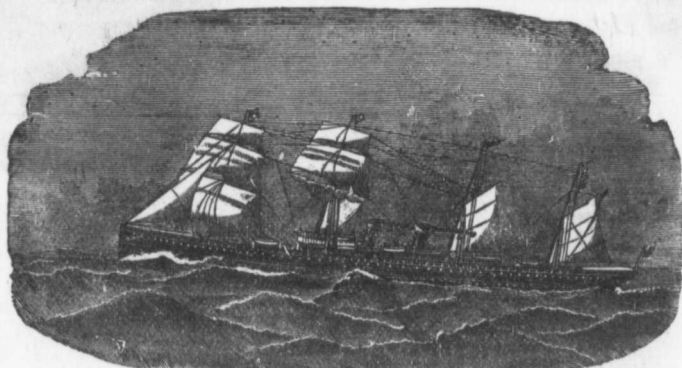

RATES OF PASSAGE:—Saloon Tickets, Montreal to Liverpool, \$40, \$50 and \$60; Return Tickets, \$80, \$90 and \$110; Intermediate \$30, round trip \$60; Steerage, \$20, round trip \$40.
